Eve is the Collection Manager of the Otis Douglas Hyde Herbarium (dried plant specimens), which are stored at the University of Washington Center for Urban Horticulture. Eve will spend the evening with us sharing

preserved orchid specimens from the collection of over 24,000 plants, as well as educate us on what the herbarium does and why it is important to our community.

The Herbarium collects and houses pressed plant specimens of accessioned plants in the UW Botanic Gardens, as well as specimens that reflect the research of students, staff and faculty. The Herbarium also harbors the Washington State Noxious Weed Control Board's Collection.

These collections, vital to science, provide information about plants in our past and present environments. They offer a view over decades and centuries that allow scientists to study the extinction of plants, track invasive species, and even shed light on climate change. The Herbarium is a storehouse of botanical DNA from the Seattle region, the Pacific Northwest and beyond.

NWOS Display at Tri-Cities Orchid Show

The Tri-Cities Orchid Show was held Oct 7th and 8th in Kennewick WA. Other than our own show, this is the last show of the Fall season for an NWOS display. Cylvia and I took about 30 plants and Mike and Abigail came Friday and brought 9 plants of their own and assisted with the setup. All told, there was a good selection of plants in our display.

Andy Wright loaned 8 plants including the huge Bulb. orthosepalum 'Age'. It was nominated by the AOS judges and won "Best Other Genera" and also "Best Plant in Show." Andy's Sievekingia reichenbachiana with a lovely cluster of delicate yellow flowers won "Best Stanhopea Alliance" and was also AOS nominated. Mike Foster and Donna Pierce sent 5 nice plants including L. anceps X Slc Sue Fordyce, also nominated by the AOS judges. Allan Kaas sent 5 plants and won "Best Vanda Alliance" with his Vanda Kulwadee 'Red' and best Cattleya Alliance with his large and very fragrant Anacheilium radiata gigantea. It's fragrance vastly overpowered the not-so-sweet fragrance of Andy's Bulb. orthosepalum. Besides those mentioned above, plants were sent by Barb Roberts, Erika Dyer and Thuan Nguyen.

Our display was quite nice, thanks to all who loaned plants. Attendance at the show seemed moderate but sales seemed to be good as the sales tables were quite sparse by the end of the show. While none of our plants received AOS awards, there were several awards in the show.

Dillon/Peterson Essay Prize - Deadline is November 30, 2017

This is a reminder that the AOS is still accepting entries for the 2016
Gordon W. Dillon/Richard C. Peterson Memorial Essay Contest. They should let their imaginations run wild and the winner will receive a cash prize and certificate suitable for framing.



This year's theme is: Species or hybrids?.

Which do you prefer and why? Do you grow hybrids because of their cultural adaptability and reliable blooming (sometimes more than once a year) or do you grow species because of the challenge and diversity? This is a chance to show off some of your favorite orchids as you use them to illustrate your points!

Membership in the American Orchid Society is not necessary to enter the contest. The deadline is November 30, 2017. The winning entry, if any, will be published in the June issue of the following year.

Contest Rules:

- The essay must be an original, unpublished article.
- The contest is open to all persons except employees of the American Orchid Society and

their immediate families.

- Submissions must be no more than 5,000 words in length.
- Manuscripts must be submitted in English, typewritten and double-spaced or submitted in Word or other compatible electronic format.
- Submissions will be judged without knowledge of the identity of the author. The decision of the judges is final. If no entries meet the expected criteria of excellence, the award will be withheld.
- Artwork is not necessary for entering this competition.

Non-winning entries will be returned to the contestant if requested. Such entries are eligible for resubmission in subsequent contests. These non-winning entries will also be considered for publication by the editor of Orchids and may be used in Orchids or other AOS publications including the AOS website.

He then wrapped up this vast presentation of knowledge with some excellent care and culture information including ranges for elevation, temperature, light, Dry/Wet as well as fertilizer and feeding. He had an excellent way of helping us understand how to pull it all together so that we can grow these marvelous plants.


